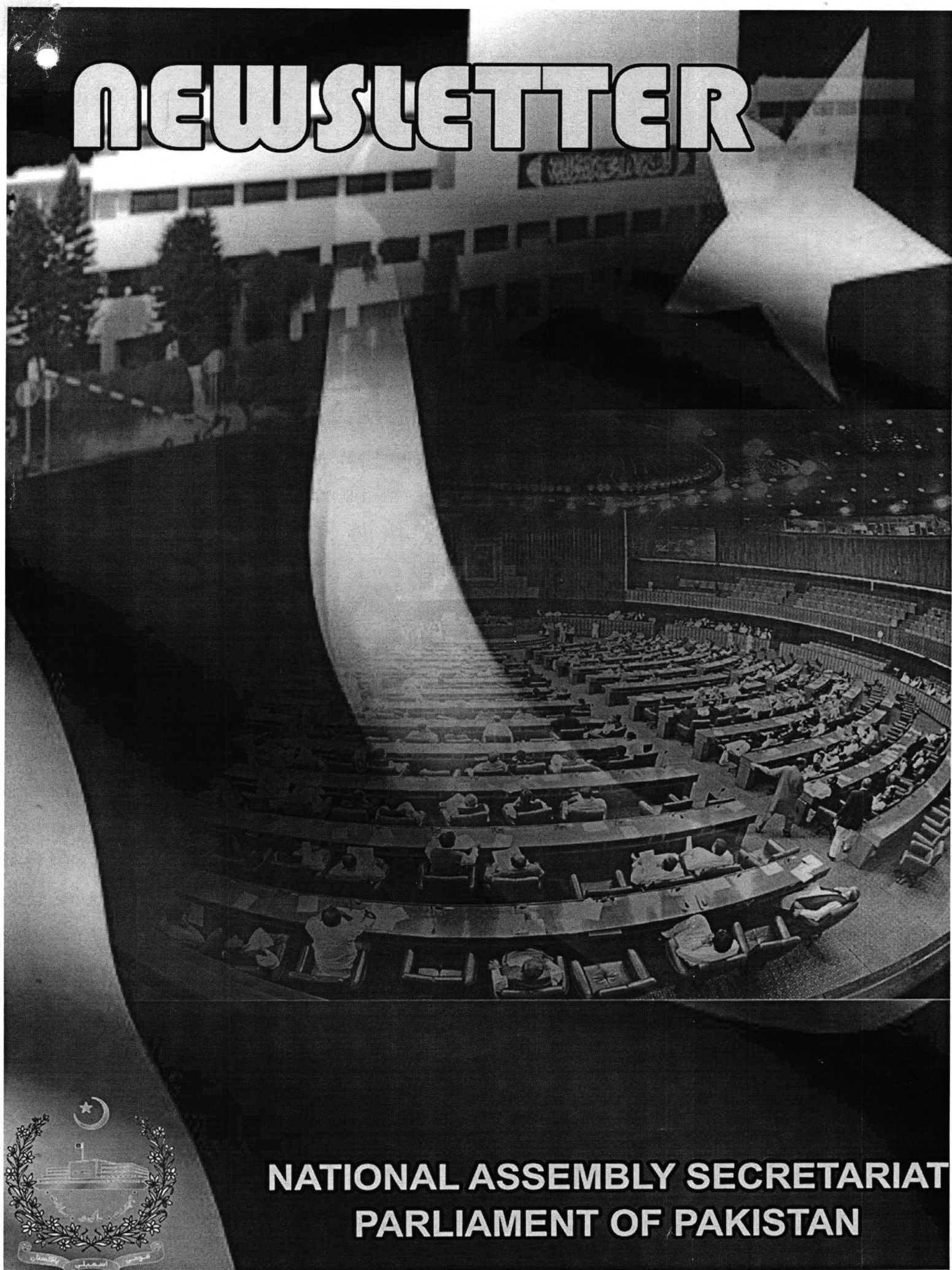
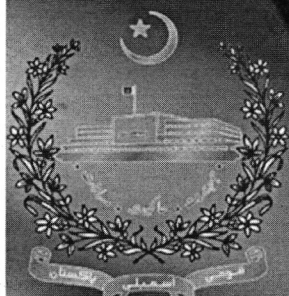

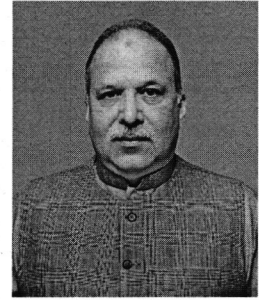




### CHIEF EDITOR'S NOTE

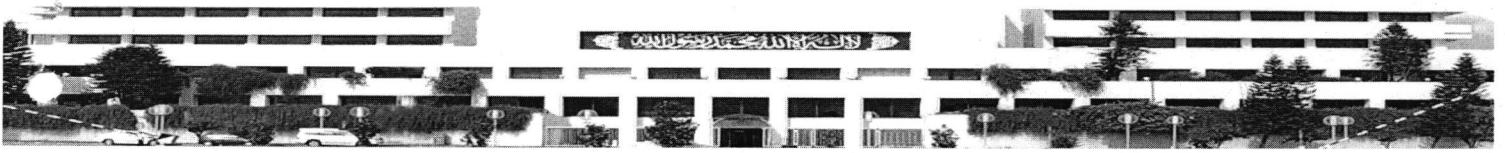

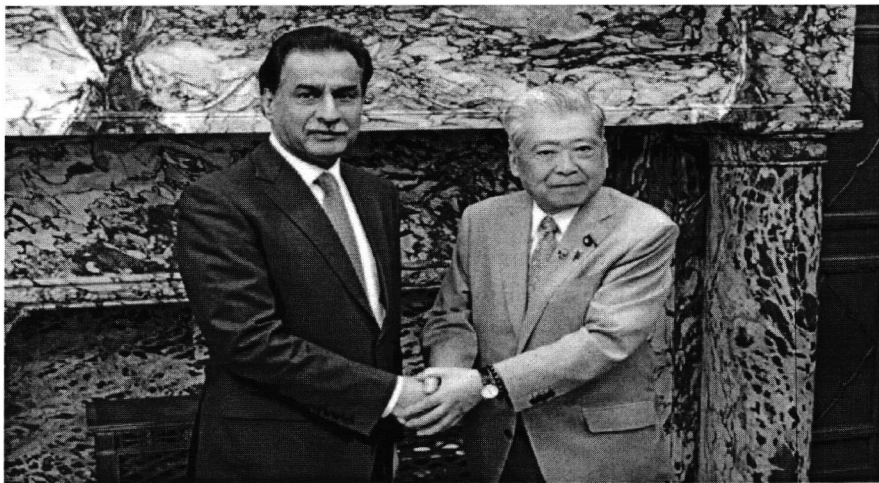
## SPEAKER OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, SARDAR AYAZ SADIQ VISITS JAPAN

On Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June, the Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq visited the House of Representatives of Japan with his delegation and met with Mr. Tadamori Oshima, Speaker of the House of Representatives of Japan.



The Speaker Oshima welcomed the delegation to Japan and offered condolences and sympathy to all those affected in the recent terror attacks in Pakistan, hoping for the improvement of public security in Pakistan. In addition, he said that he was glad that their countries marked the 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties, and thanked the Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq for vigorously acting as President of the Pakistan-Japan Parliamentary Friendship Group for the strengthening of the bilateral relationship.

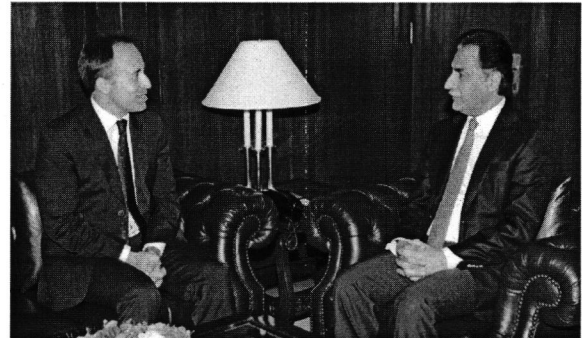
In reply, the Pakistani Speaker thanked Speaker Oshima for his welcome and expressed expectation for Japanese firms to make greater inroads into Pakistan, mentioning that there were many investment opportunities in his country, including road and railway construction. In addition, he reiterated appreciation for the support Pakistan had received from the Japanese Government, including economic and humanitarian assistance. Other subjects including the further activation of parliamentary exchange also came under discussion.

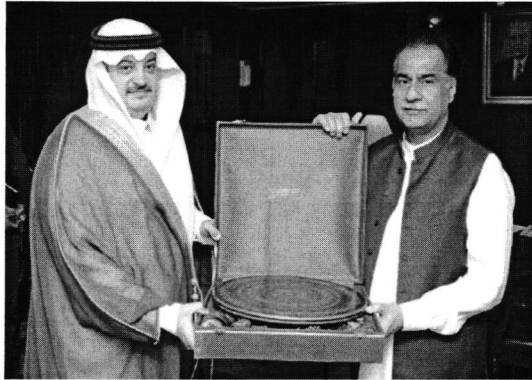


A South Korean Parliamentary delegation led by Speaker National Assembly of Korea, Chung Sye-Kyun met with the Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq. The delegation was invited by the Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq for promoting bilateral parliamentary exchanges and supplementing

government-to-government interaction. The Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq underscored that Pakistan is committed to a sustained and comprehensive bilateral engagement with Republic of Korea. He added that Pakistan is a promising market for Korean technological and manufacturing expertise. Convener of the Pak- Korean Friendship Group, Mr. Qaiser Ahmad Sheikh was also present in the meeting. Wide range of issues including enhancing parliamentary and economic ties between Pakistan and Republic of Korea came under discussion.

While talking to Mr. Nawaf Saeed Ahmed Al-Maliki, Ambassador of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, who called on him in Parliament House, the Speaker said that Pakistan wanted stability and peace in the region as it was necessary for prosperity and development of the region. He said that the menace of extremism and terrorism had adversely affected the region's progress, and stressed the need for collective efforts to overcome it. "Muslims are victimized all over the world and this is the right time that Muslim countries should think positive for

each other" the Speaker urged. Sardar Ayaz Sadiq said that the current instability, sectarian divisions, and immense human under-development in the Muslim world have retarded genuine development and fruitful integration of the Muslim world.

**AMBASSADOR OF BELARUS MR. ANDREI ERMOLOVICH CALLED ON THE SPEAKER OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF PAKISTAN, SARDAR AYAZ SADIQ AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE ON 23.10.2017**

Sardar Ayaz Sadiq underscored that relations between the two countries have grown at an unprecedented pace in the last few years. Efforts were being made to consolidate bilateral ties in diverse areas, he added. The Speaker said that regular interaction among Parliamentarians was essential to deepen relations between the two countries. The Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq further said that "Parliaments serve as vital bridges in forging people-to-people contacts, enhancing understanding and promoting mutually beneficial cooperation."



He proposed exchange of visits by members of Pakistan-Belarus friendship groups. Ermolovich said that the Parliament of Belarus would be delighted to enhance its relations with the Parliament of Pakistan so that understanding and cooperation between both the countries could be further pursued.

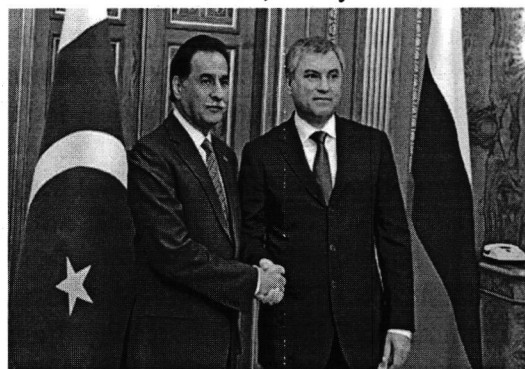


The two sides undertook a comprehensive review of bilateral ties and discussed ways and means to enhance cooperation in diverse spheres, especially in the fields of economy, trade and commerce. Cooperation in energy, industry, investment, agriculture, Science Technology and Innovation (STI), Information and Communication Technology (ICT), education, culture, defence and Parliamentary exchanges also

came under discussion. They also deliberated on the emerging peace and security environment at regional and global level. Poland Senate Chairman Stanislaw Karczewski, while thanking the speaker for his kind words, said his country also attaches huge importance to Pakistan and wants to revitalise its bilateral relations. He said his country strongly desires to enhance its parliamentary relations, apart from cooperation in other fields.

**SPEAKER OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, SARDAR AYAZ SADIQ ATTENDED INTERNATIONAL PARLIAMENTARY CONFERENCE IN MOSCOW RUSSIA, 3-5 DECEMBER 2017**

The Parliamentarians against Drugs Conference was held on December 4, this year in Moscow. The one-day Conference consisted of a high-level plenary session and panel discussions. The Parliamentarians from 58 countries participated in the Conference. Seven countries sent their Speakers of Supreme Legislative bodies, who came forward with reports on the plenary meeting. The Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq participated in the conference to represent Parliament of Pakistan.





On the sidelines of the International Conference, the Speaker of the National Assembly, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq held a bilateral meeting with the Chairman Duma of the Russian Federation Mr. Vyacheslav Volodin on 4<sup>th</sup> December. The Speaker of the National Assembly, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq conveyed Pakistan's appreciation to State Duma for taking the initiative to host the first International Conference on "Parliamentarians against Drugs". Chairman State Duma expressed appreciation for high level participation from Pakistan in the Conference. Mr. Volodin said that he was looking forward to his visit to Pakistan to participate in the regional conference on "Challenges of Terrorism and Inter-Regional Connectivity" to be held in Islamabad later this month. During another meeting with Mr. Ali Larijani, the Speaker of the Islamic Consultative Assembly of Iran, both the leaders underscored the role of the lawmakers in strengthening relations between the two countries. Both the sides agreed to further enhance bilateral relations between Pakistan and Iran through closer Inter-parliamentary Cooperation.

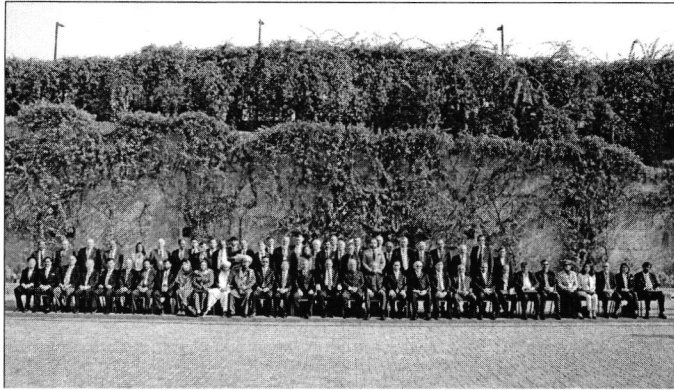

This visit was initially an opportunity to strengthen ties between French and Pakistani Parliaments in several high-level talks with Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, Mrs. Nafisa Shah and other members of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the National Assembly, Senator Lt. Gen. (Retd.) Abdul Qayyum, Convener of the Pakistan-France Friendship Group at the Senate of Pakistan and members of the Pakistan-France Friendship Group in the National Assembly of Pakistan.



## FIRST SPEAKERS' CONFERENCE ON 24<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2017 IN ISLAMABAD



The Speakers and the Heads of delegations of the National Parliaments of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, Peoples' Republic of China, Islamic Republic of Iran, Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Russian Federation and the Republic of Turkey undaunted by challenges gathered in Islamabad dated December 24<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The Conference deliberated in detail about the idea of articulating the respective parliamentarians' narrative on the

imperative need of identifying, promoting and developing a common socio-economic interest of these countries to secure mutual well being, peace, harmony and development of the region in particular and the world in general. The President of Pakistan, Mr. Mamnoon Hussain, the Honorable Chief Guest and Mr. Raza Rabbani, Chairman, Senate of Pakistan addressed the inaugural session.

The Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, Chairman of the 1<sup>st</sup> Speakers' Conference, in his welcome address deliberated that terrorism ever since 9/11 has caused a colossal dent to the global economy. Problems such as the rise of illicit drug trafficking and the ever escalating terror financing has further exacerbated the security situation in this region. He stressed that as regionally connected nations, the participating countries must live with each other in peace, trust and mutual respect. He suggested the need of Permanent Speakers' Parliamentary Forum of the six participating countries. He offered that the National Assembly of Pakistan can serve as the Secretariat of the Forum. Furthermore, the Honorable Speaker of National Assembly of Pakistan, proposed the formulation of Inter-Parliamentary Committees on the Counter Terrorism and Interregional Connectivity.



An intellectually engaging debate on **“Seeking Joint Strategies to Combat the Threat of Terrorism in the Region: The Role of Parliaments”** was deliberated upon during the first session of the conference. The keynotes were delivered by delegates from Afghanistan, China, Pakistan, Russian Federation and Turkey during the session. The speeches revolved around the plausible strategies in curbing the menace of terrorism in the region. 1<sup>st</sup> Speakers' Conference on Exploring Parliamentary Cooperation for Regional Peace, Connectivity and Prosperity successfully concluded on a historic milestone in shape of the Islamabad Declaration, Partnership for Peace, Development and Connectivity.

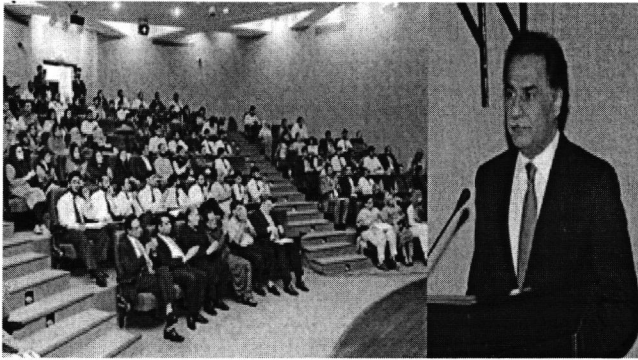

## PARLIAMENT HOUSE TURNED PINK IN SUPPORT OF PINK RIBBON. "GOVERNMENT IS COMMITTEED TO PROVIDE HEALTH FACILITIES TO ALL CITIZEN": NA SPEAKER OCTOBER 3, 2017

The Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq said that thousands of precious lives had lost every year from breast cancer just because of mere ignorance. Breast Cancer is the only cancer if diagnosed at early stage; chances of survival are more than 90%. He further said that we would extend full support to the **"Pink Ribbon"** for creating early detection and ensuring saving lives. He said this in his message on the awareness



campaign of "Pink Ribbon" being commemorated in October. The Speaker said that the pink ribbon is an international symbol of breast cancer awareness. For this purpose, Parliament House Building illuminated into pink lights in support of "Pink Ribbon". That illumination was a part of National breast cancer awareness drive which started from 1<sup>st</sup> October to 31<sup>st</sup> of the month. At the Parliament House Building; the illumination lasted for three days. During those three days, the Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan and other Parliamentarians also expressed their concerns over this extremely dominant health issue among Pakistani women.



## THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY OF HUMAN RIGHTS

The Standing Committee on Ministry of Human rights met 06 times during the period 1<sup>st</sup> July - 31<sup>st</sup> December 2017.



The agenda for debate included discussion on the issues of Human Rights violation in respect of allotment of plots to the affectees of Tarbella Dam, briefing on investigations of the murder case of Bakhshish Elahi, Journalist from Haripur. The Committee considered the Bill titled as "The Islamabad Capital Territory Child Protection Bill, 2017" (Government Bill) (Referred on 15-05-2017) and approved unanimously with

the amendment in sub-section (b) of section 5 as "is unattended, victim of an offence, child domestic & such other workers found begging, imprisoned with the mother or lives in immoral environment". The Committee also considered the Bill titled as "The Juvenile Justice System Bill, 2017" (Government Bill) (Referred on 24-05-2017) and approved unanimously with the minor amendment in sub-section 1 of section 8.

The Committee also discussed the already established implementation cell and the Help Line for free of cost legal advice to the Human Rights violation cases and referral for redressal. The Committee also condemned the Human Rights violation in occupied Kashmir by the Indian Security Forces. Various other issues of abolishing contract systems in factories/industries for labourers were also discussed.

## NATIONAL ASSEMBLY STANDING COMMITTEE ON RELEGIOUS AFFAIRS AND INTERFAITH HARMONY

The Standing Committee on Religious Affairs and Inter-faith harmony met 04 times during the period 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2017 – 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2017. The following matters were discussed.

The Committee had briefing on the award of quota to Hajj Tour Operators especially after directions of Supreme Court of Pakistan. It was apprised in the Committee that 2% quota was provided by the Hajj Policy Formulation Committee constituted by the Supreme Court of Pakistan to the top most new 29 Companies on merit basis. The Committee expressed displeasure on the provision of wrong quota to the new companies by the M/o Religious Affairs ignoring the high powered committee constituted by the Prime-Minister, Islamic Republic of Pakistan.





The Committee also unanimously decided to reject that list of 29 new companies and suggested that M/o Religious Affairs have 40% Private Sector quota of 71684 pilgrims out of which 10% quota of pilgrims should be decreased of those who has 150 pilgrims or more than it, which becomes 7168 pilgrims whereas new tour operators should not be given quota of more than 50 pilgrims.

Matters regarding problems being faced by the Hujjaj who were travelling from Quetta by Pakistan International Airline (PIA) were also discussed and the Committee decided that Civil Aviation Authority would be called in its next meeting to discuss the future planning for Hajj 2018. The Committee recommended that Ministry of Religious Affairs and Inter-faith Harmony will provide the details of last 03 years hardship Hajj quota issued on the recommendations of the Members of the National Assembly. The Committee considered "the National Commission for Minorities Bill, 2015 (moved by Ms. Belun Hasnain, MNA)", "the National Commission for Minorities Bill, 2015 (moved by Mr. Lal Chand Malhi, MNA); and "the National Commission for Minorities Bill, 2016 (moved by Mr. Sanjay Perwani, MNA" in detail. The Committee constituted the sub-Committee under the Convener-ship of Mr. Ali Muhammad Khan, MNA to consider the Bills and submit the report within 30 days.

### STANDING COMMITTEE ON INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND TELECOMMUNICATION



The Standing Committee on Information Technology and Telecommunication met 04 times from 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2017 – 31<sup>st</sup> December 2017.

It was informed in the Committee that Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) had already established a Web

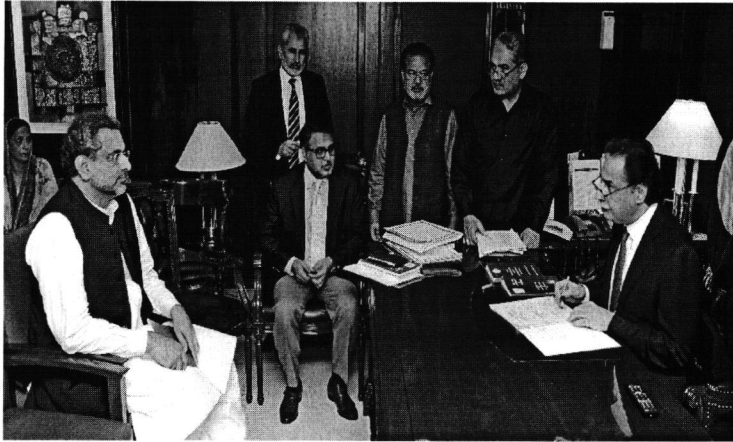
Analysis Cell where 25 personnel are working solely on identifying unlawful content on internet including the blasphemous. In this regard, PTA blocked 12,977 URLs Blasphemous URLs and more than 6000 complaints were reviewed and processed accordingly. Facebook has also designated focal person to coordinate with PTA for prompt action against the reported material. Facebook authorities reiterated their commitment towards removal/blocking of the blasphemous and objectionable content and assured that they will improve the cooperation and response time.

It was also announced that the Special Communication Organization (SCO) was made part of legislation through section 40 of Pakistan Telecom (Re-Organization) Act, 1996. Special Communications Organization Notwithstanding anything contained in section 39, the telecom services, within the Northern Areas and Azad Jammu & Kashmir shall be operated by the SCO and the Authority shall issue a license to the organization accordingly.

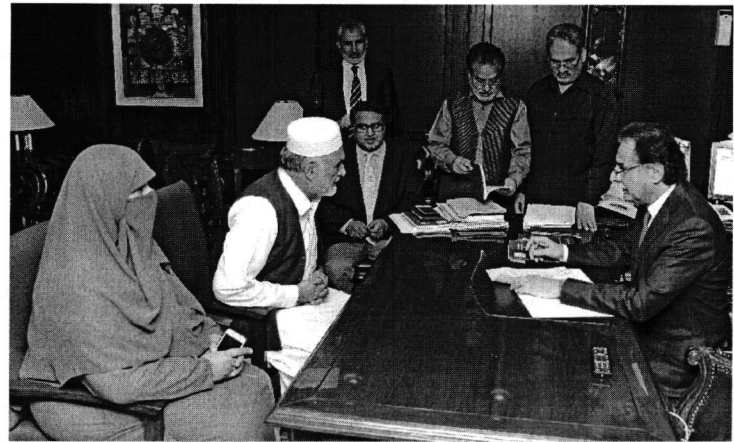

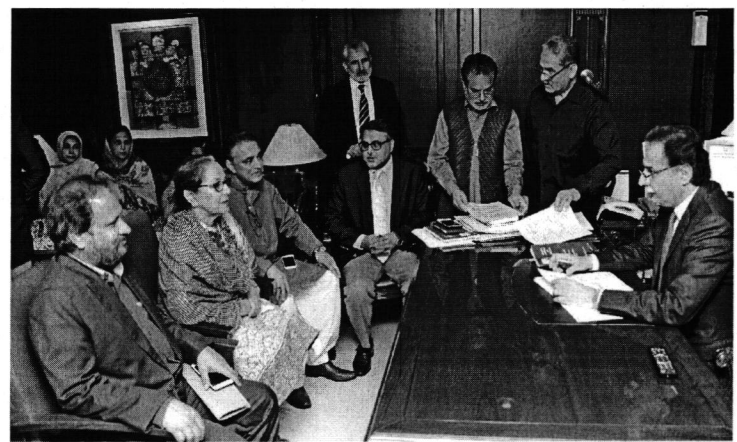

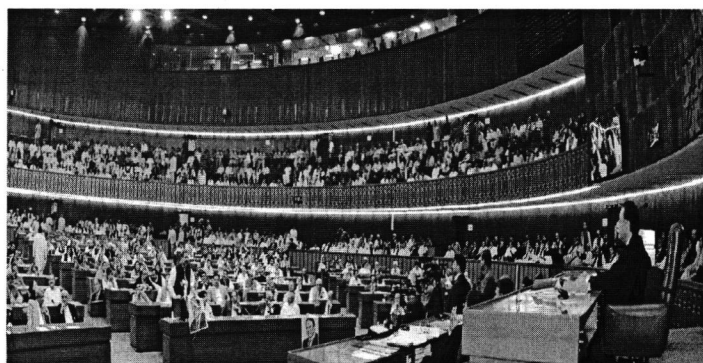

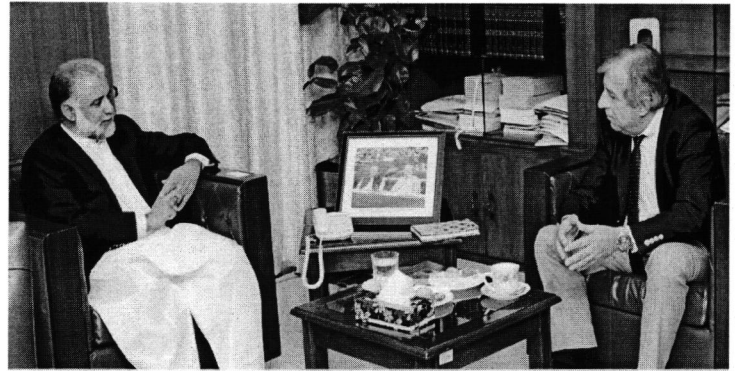

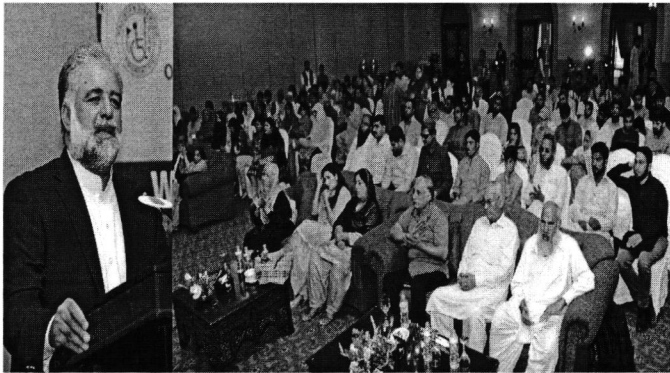
